The course is taught in English.

How It Works

The Interpreting for Professionals Course is an online interactive, skills-based program for spoken and sign language interpreters. It is also the most up-to-date program in the field. The sessions ground you in what you need to know to work as a professional interpreter.

The focus is on medical, social services and educational settings. With this program, you receive a copy of the most comprehensive textbook and workbook in the field. Course practicums will strengthen your interpreter skills.
